


The Salisbury Centre Volunteer Role Title: Community Celebration Volunteer

About Community Celebrations at the Salisbury Centre

The Salisbury Centre holds community celebrations for each of the eight Celtic 'wheel of the year' festivals. These festivals mark the turning of the seasons, honouring both the inner and outer shifts that each season brings. Rituals and activities are held to allow us to notice and reflect upon what this part of the year is asking of us and are an opportunity for members of the Centre's diverse community to come together. The events are offered free / by donation and on a drop-in basis, and are attended by volunteers, room hirers and members of our wider community. These celebrations come around about every six weeks, as is shown in the image below:



Role Description

There are a number of different roles available at each community celebration, and you will be part of a wider team of volunteers from different background.

You're invited to change around roles for each event if they want to, to give the opportunity for skill sharing and experiencing the celebrations from different perspectives. Some roles involve some advance preparation and more responsibility, while others just involve showing up! All these roles are supported by the two Community Development Workers, so feel free to try out something you haven't done before. Skills, Experience, Attributes & Commitment Required

Essential skills & attributes

- To have a passion for bringing communities together;
- Good team-working and communication skills, and the willingness to work as part of a mutually supportive team;
- Willingness to follow the Centre's [Terms & Conditions](#), and to act with respect to the Salisbury Centre's vision, mission and values as well as community members, other centre users and the environment

Advantageous skills:

- Any experience or skills you would like to offer and share for our events.
- Experience being involved with running community events.
- Experience relevant to any of the roles.
- Creativity and ideas!

Commitment required

We want to make sure that volunteering with the Salisbury Centre fits in with your other responsibilities and commitments. You're welcome to take on different roles at different events, as each has different levels of responsibility, involvement, and preparation.

These events take place on evenings and weekends. We encourage volunteers to be part of the community celebrations team for at least 6 months, but you do not have to be available for every festival. The volunteer team meets between festivals to reflect and prepare, and take part in (optional) trainings, skill-shares, and social gatherings in the beautiful premises of the Salisbury Centre.

Inclusivity & Accessibility

We are striving towards a diverse and inclusive community environment; therefore, we gladly welcome volunteers from all races, gender identities, ethnic minorities, ages, classes, and sexual orientations. While the Centre is not currently fully physically accessible, see below, we welcome volunteers with access needs.

Physical access

Most spaces in which the celebrations are held are on the ground floor. The Salisbury Centre has newly built access paths and disabled toilets. However, access to the garden currently still involves a few steps and there is stairs up to the studio.

The role does not require physical abilities and we are keen to work together on adapting any role to your needs and skills.

If you have access needs of any kind or ideas on how to make the project more accessible, please let us know of anything we can do to support you to volunteer in the Salisbury Centre.

Support For Volunteers

The Community Development Team will support you with your role throughout, together with the wider volunteer team. We will make sure that you can access any training you need for your volunteering role, as well as coordinate skill shares between members of the volunteer team (eg. fire building, photography, labyrinth making, crafts...)
